## WHAT'S IT ABOUT?

This is a mid-nineteenth century timetable for Bayley's School in Coventry. It shows that the range of subjects taught at the school had been widened by this point to include vocal music and drawing. By the 1850s the school had fifty boys, who were admitted at 10-11 years old for three years. On leaving the school most boys were apprenticed to a trade.
